## THE COUNTY OF CUMBRIA (B5289 HIGH HILL, KESWICK) (40 MPH SPEED LIMIT) AND (BRANTHWAITE ROAD, LILLYHALL) (30 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 20><

## STATEMENT OF REASONS

Cumbria County Council propose to make the above Order, for the following reasons specified in Section 1(1) Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, namely to:

<u>Proposal 1</u> – Introduce a 40 mph speed limit along that section of the B5289 High Hill, Keswick, from its junction with the A66, extending in an easterly direction for approximately 420m; in order to moderate vehicle speeds on the approach to Keswick as traffic leaves the A66

- (a) for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or
- (c) for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians).

<u>Proposal 2</u> – Reduce the existing 50 mph speed limit to a 30 mph speed limit on C2054 from a point 80 metres south-east of its junction with Joseph Noble Road to its junction with the A595; in order to moderate moderate vehicle speeds on the approach to Lillyhall Industrial Estate as traffic leaves the A595, whilst approaching a newly constructed roundabout and accesses to new and existing sections of the industrial estate

- (a) for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or
- (c) for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians).
