## APPLICATION REPORT

### Application Summary

The Right2Work programme is a unique offer for young people living in Cumbria. The programme focuses on supporting a young people's personal development and social skills, enabling them to have a voice, influence and place in their community and society as a whole. The support is needs-led providing tailored emotional, social and practical help for a child/young person with additional needs, mental health issues, a learning or physical disabilities. The programme supports young people who are beginning to disengage with school or college due to emotional issues, health conditions, bereavement or other personal problems.

The programme can accommodate five young people supporting them into education, training and employment. This will include a real work placement via in work support, employability and functional skills qualification and an individual vocational profile. The scheme works in partnership with established networks with Job Centre Plus, local employers, social work teams, psychologists, CAMHS and careers advice services.

Cumbria County Council's local Committees in Allerdale, Carlisle, Eden and South Lakeland supported the R2W Programme during 2020 and 2021. The programme demonstrated outstanding outcomes and made a significant impact on the employability of the young individuals who participated in the programme in Cumbria.

Funding a follow-on pilot Right2Work programme across Cumbria will strengthen the evidence needed to develop the programme as a commissioned service. Other CCC departments including Targeted Youth Support have commented that the support and engagement for young people through R2W isn't offered by any other provision.

An application for funding to support a follow-on pilot to the 2020-2021 programme has been submitted to Allerdale, Carlisle, Eden and South Lakeland.
