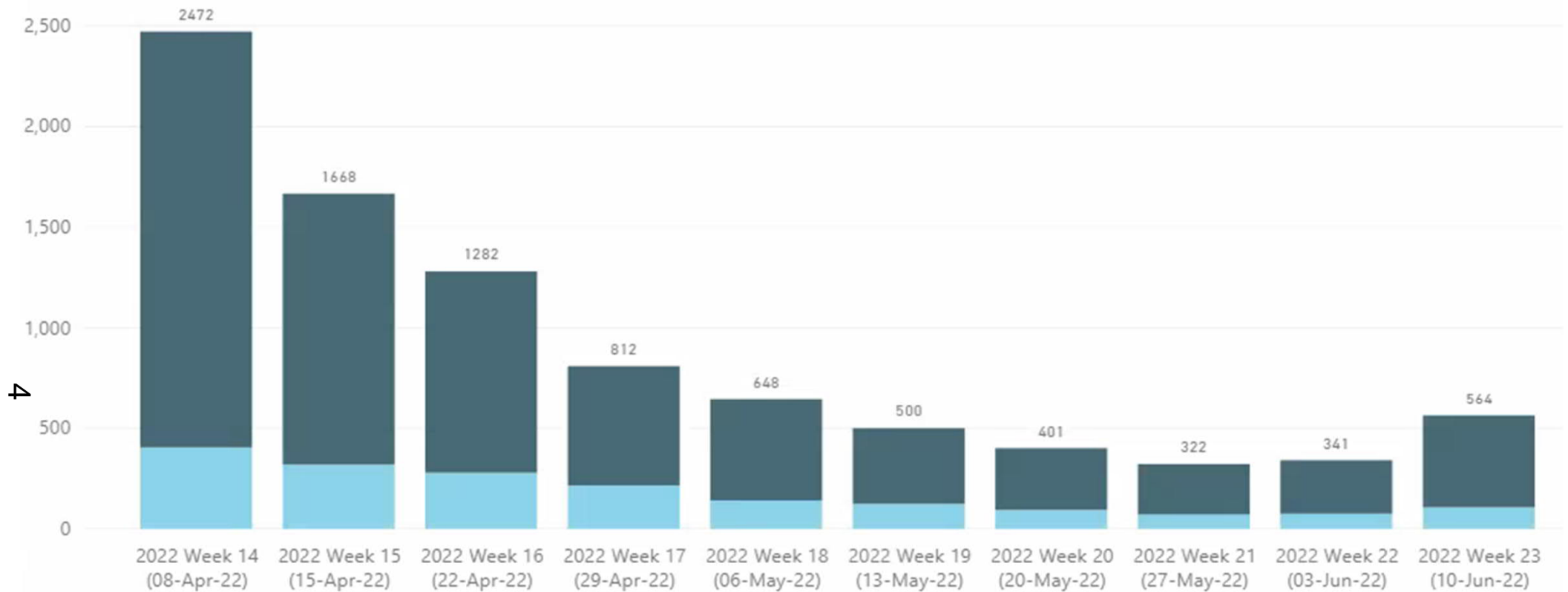

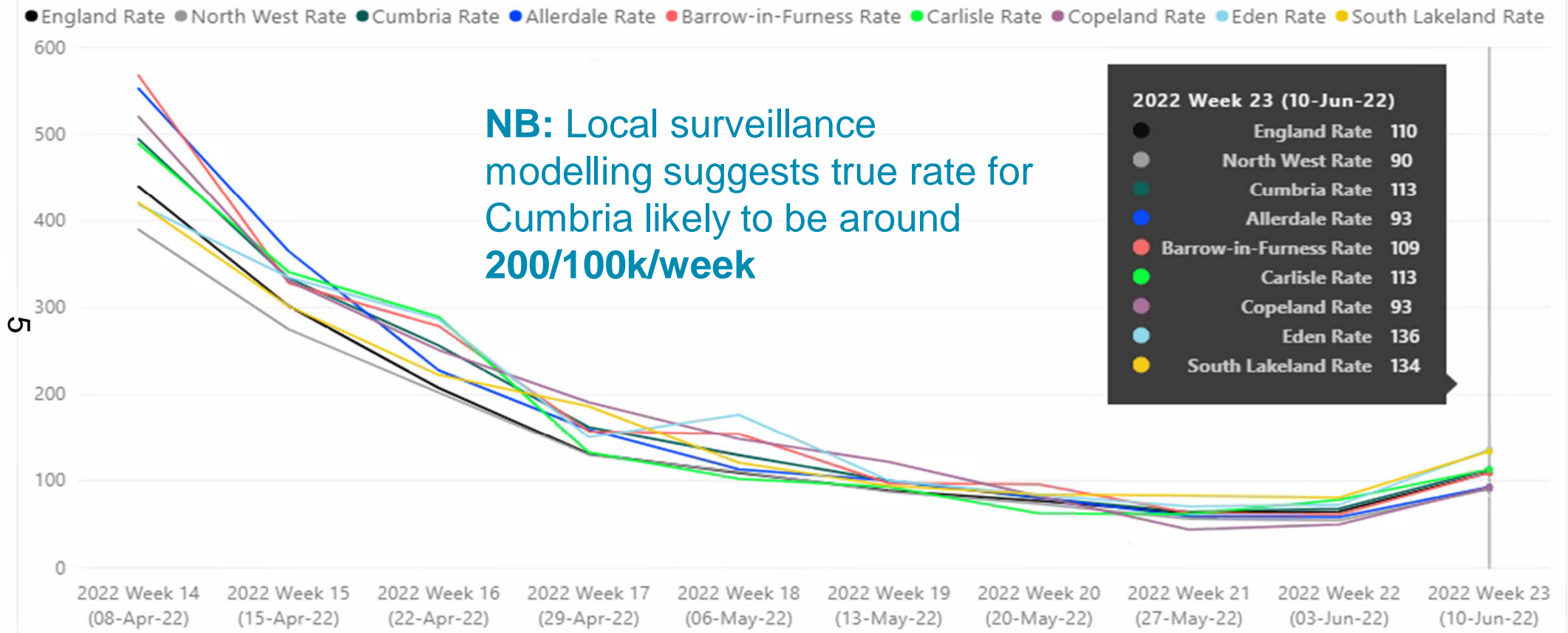

Rate of Weekly Cases Per 100,000 Population

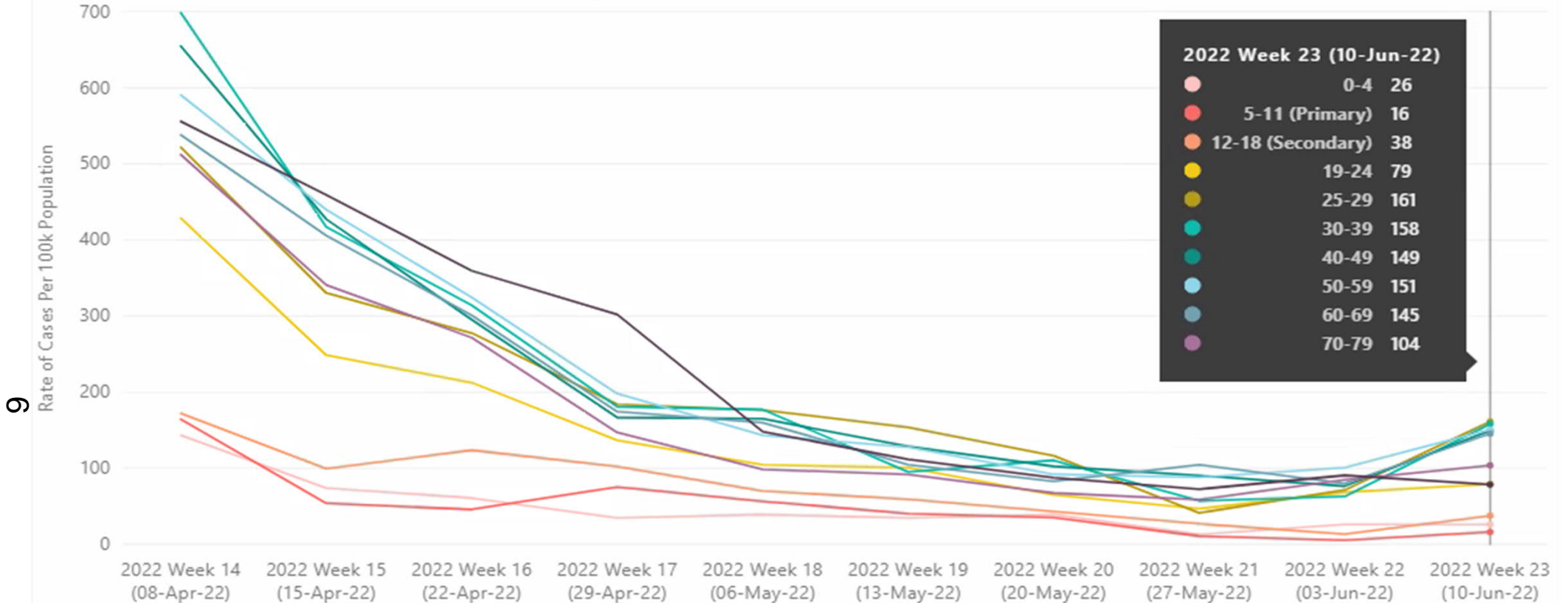

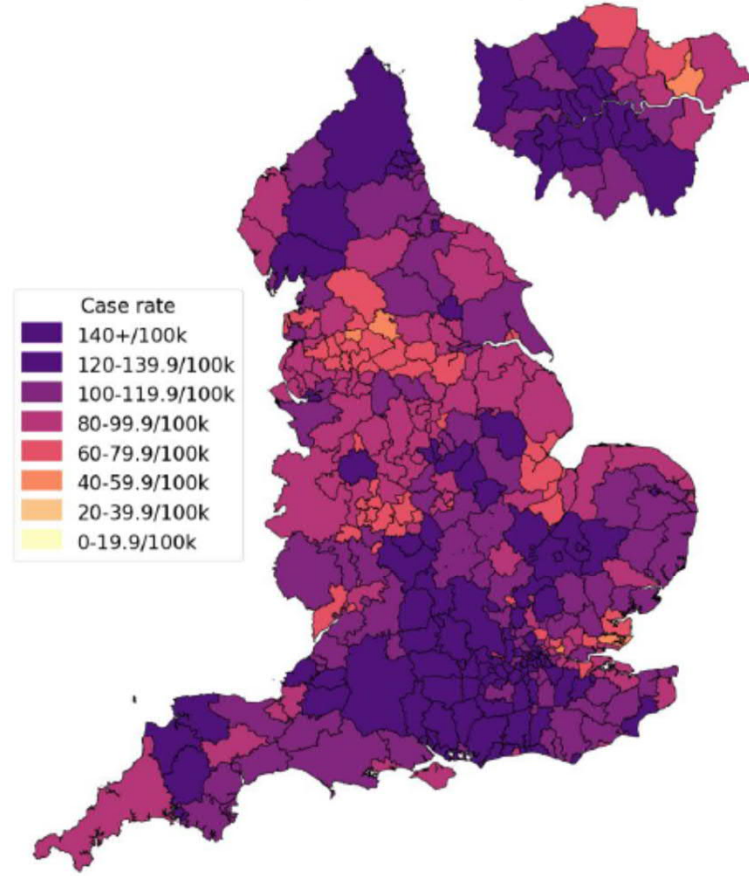

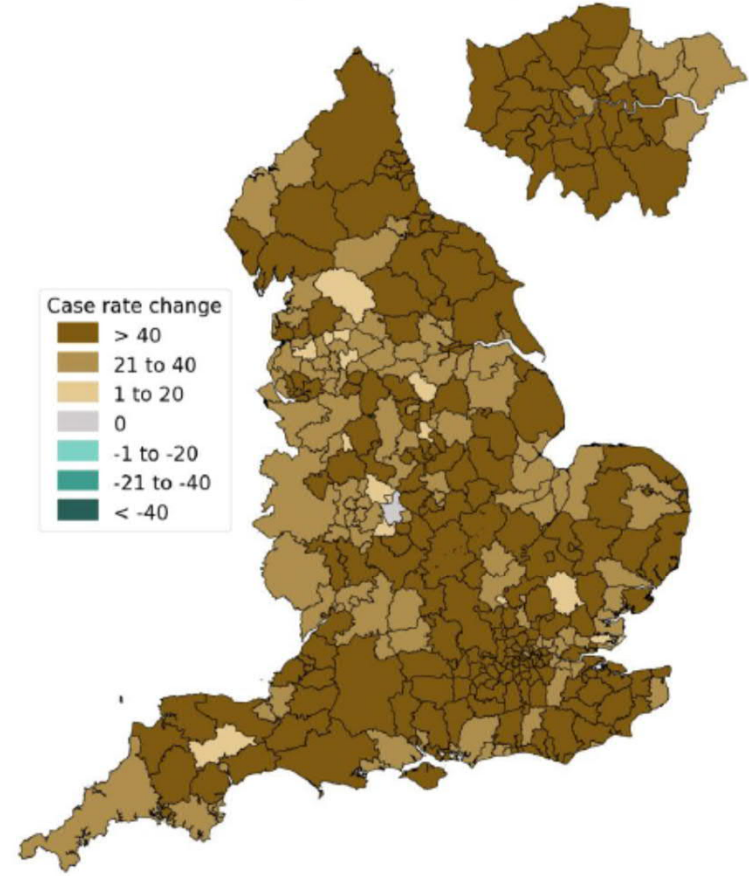

04 June 2022 to 10 June 2022

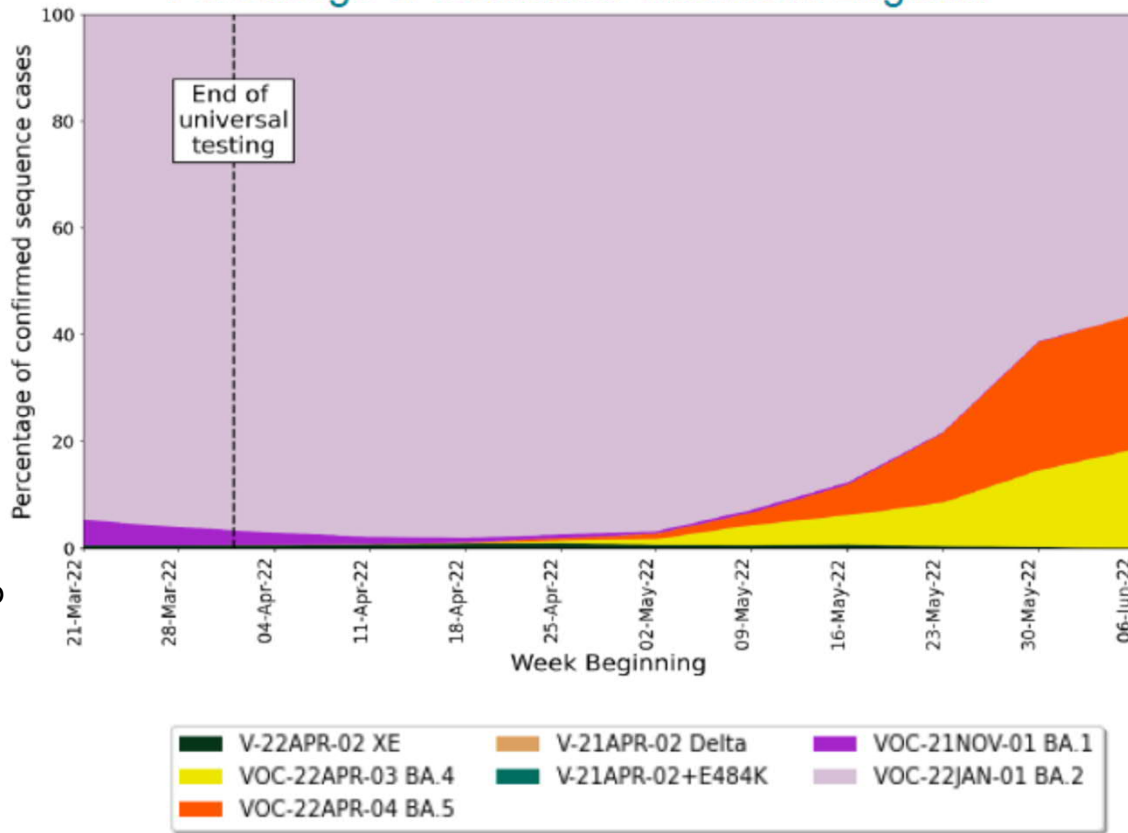

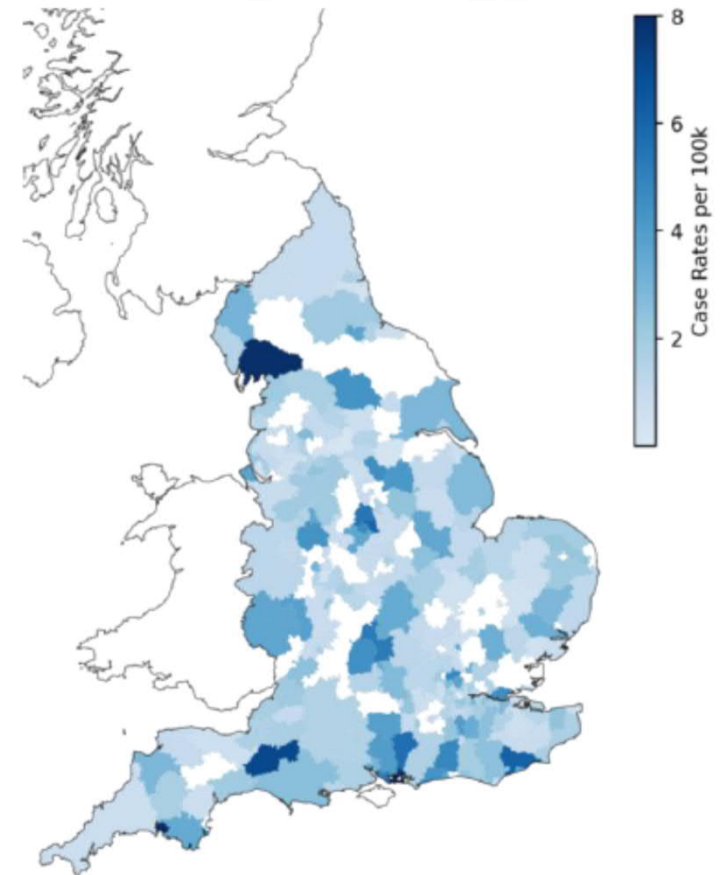

Percentage of Confirmed Variants in England

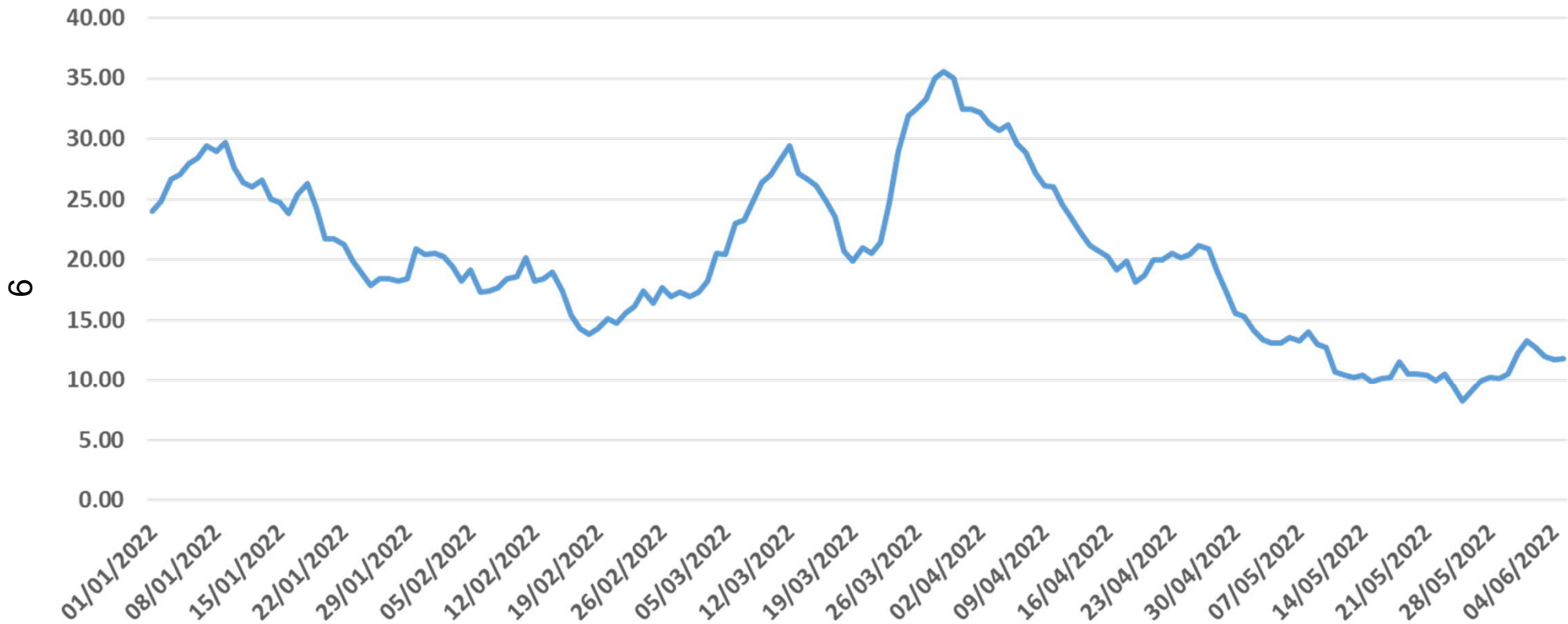


Confirmed Cases of VOC-22APR-04/BA.5 (previous 28 days)

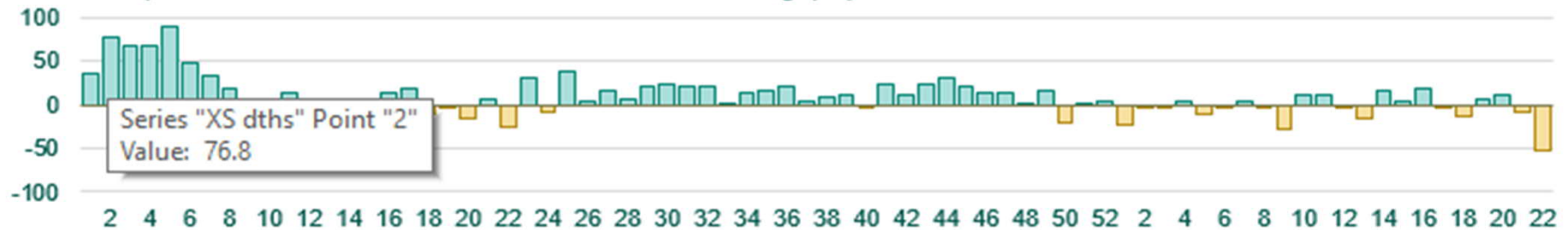
Hospital daily Covid admissions, UHMB+NCIC, 7-day rolling average



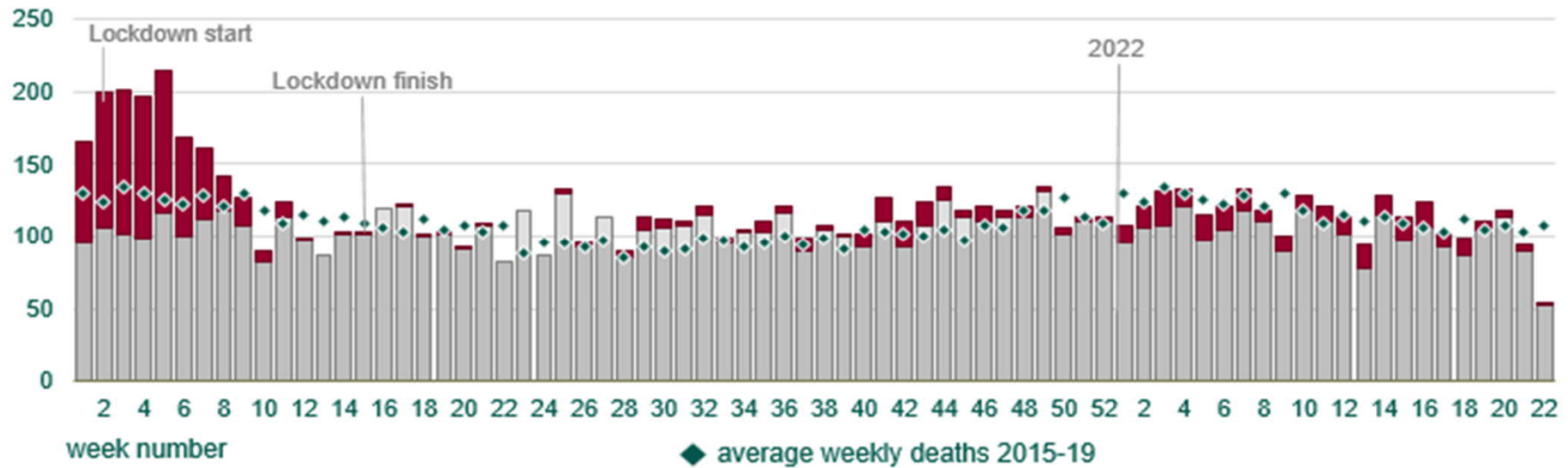

All deaths in 2021 and 2022 by week, with proportion where COVID-19 is mentioned

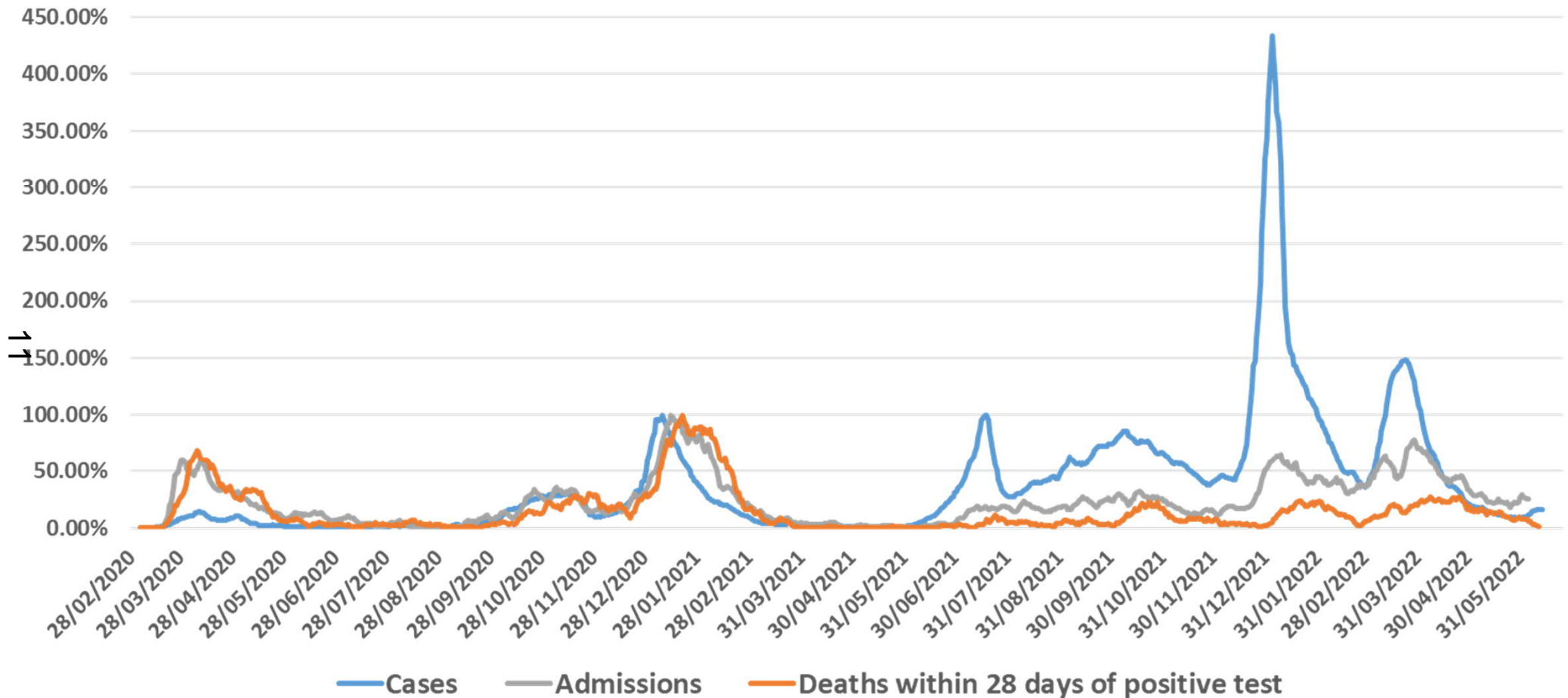

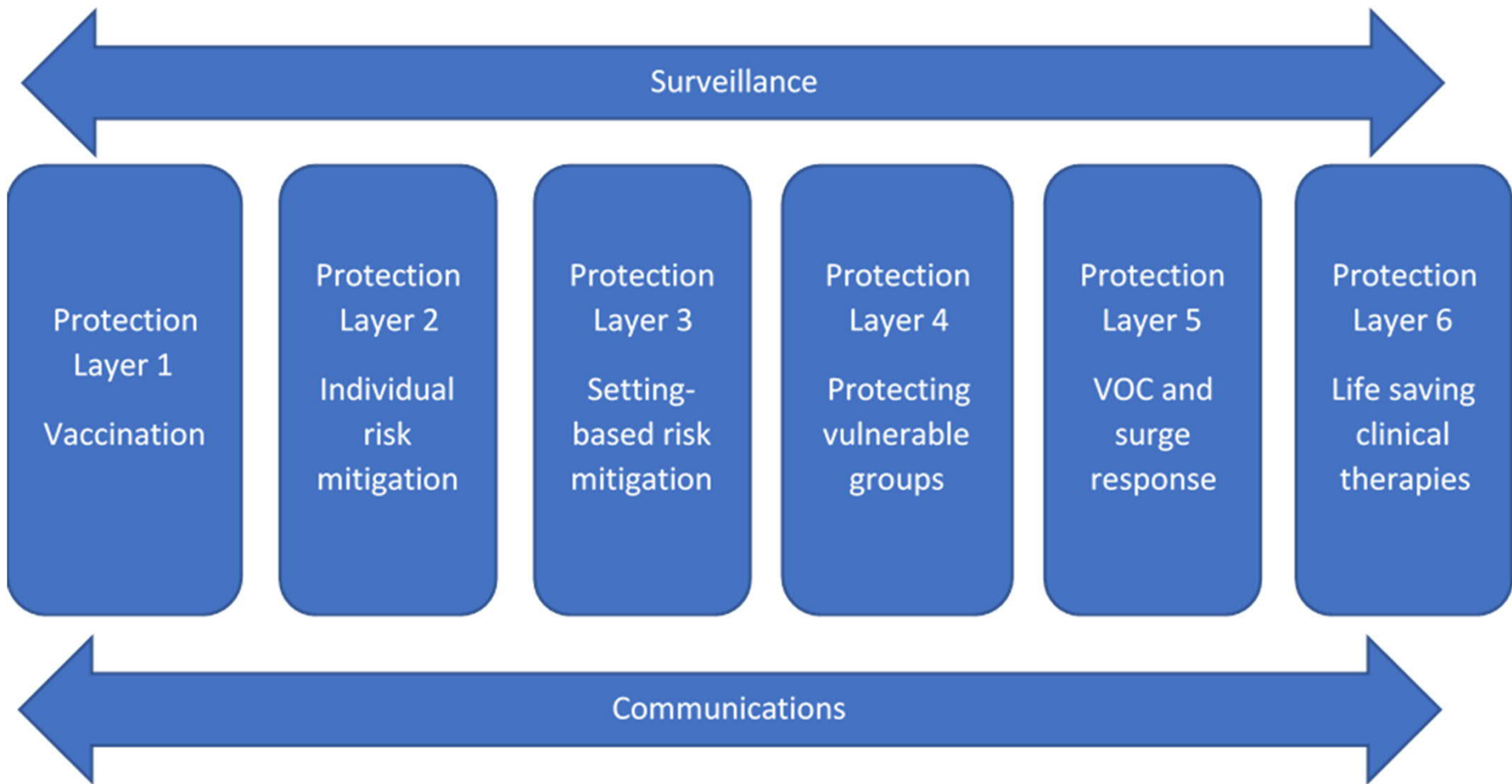
